

# Cricket Square Renovations Guide – Print off

<b>Day One</b> 1-		Staff(min) 1	<b>Day Two</b> 1-	Scarify 3 direction, to remove surface canopy around 3-5mm in depth. More as required	2/3
2-	Verti Cut & Cut to thin out grass canopy	1	2-	Brush/rotary/mow collection between scarifying directions	
3-	Water the square to soften profile, to assist scarifier & mark corners	1	3-	Scarify to finish depth of thatch in 1/2 directions, 1 mm below deepest thatch layer.	2/3
			4--	Brush and collect up scarifying debris	
			5-	Using a cyclone spreader, seed (quarter/half rate) and possible brush in.	
			Go to day 3, If you need to re water to allow for spiking		
			<b>Day Two/Three</b> 6-	Sarel spike (2/3 directions) or and spike the square to no deeper than an inch (stop if surface lifting). Applying seed between each sarel direction and brush in.  Opportunity to add a pre seed fertiliser at this point, or once completely top dressed.	2/3
			7-	Top dress ends, with loam and a bit of seed and firm by foot.	
			8-	Top dress the rest of the square 6-8 bag, enough to restore levels.	
			9-	Dragmat/brush/loot/straight edge the topdressing to create an even coverage of loam. Add more loam as required too low areas, but don't bury any existing grass.	2/3
			10-	Go back to the ends and double check levels, if required use a straight edge or loot to level.	
			11-	Mark corners of the square and if possible, erect some type of fencing.	
			Two-week post renovations	The first two weeks are key to seed success so keep moist, avoid over watering that may cause wash off.	1
			12-	First cut 3/4 weeks after renovations.	

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
